# PUBLIC HEARING ON LOCAL LAWS TUESDAY, APRIL 23, 1985 3:15 P.M. - CITY HALL

The last bill on today's public hearing calendar is Introductory Number 872, introduced by Mike De Marco and co-sponsored Council Members Colon, Crispino, Dear and Wooten.

The bill would name the triangle at the intersection of Randall and Calhoun Avenues and the Cross Bronx Expressway service road, in the Throggs Neck section of the Bronx, in honor of John J. McNamara, the local Bronx historian. This legislation is unusual for two reasons. First of all, it is rare that the Council elects to name streets or parks in honor of living people, and indeed, while Mr. McNamara is in his seventies, he is very much alive, and still in great demand as a public speaker. The second thing that is unusual about this street-name change legislation is that Mr. McNamara is the author of History in Asphalt, a 569-page history of street-names in the Bronx! What better way for the Throggs Neck community to honor its local historian, John McNamara, than to name this area for him?

John McNamara was born in the Melrose section of the Bronx, but moved to Throggs Neck with his family when he was four. When he was a young boy, McNamara befriended Captain Charlie Ferreira, the lighthouse keeper at Fort Schuyler, who

gave him some old charts of the area. These sparked McNamara's curiosity, and started his life-long interest in Bronx history.

McNamara has never really left Throggs Neck; he married a neighborhood girl, the former Pauline Ungerer, and raised his family there. A freelance writer for more than fifty years, McNamara began his popular Bronx Press-Review column, "The Bronx in History" in 1956. McNamara was a founding member of the Bronx Historical Society, and his interest in local history is almost religious. McNamara has walked every byway, path, street, concourse and avenue in the borough, searching for clues to the origins of their names. His years of meticulous research culminated in the 1978 publication of History in Asphalt, which the Bronx County Historical Society rereleased in a new, expanded edition last summer.

SUBJECT:

In relation to an area name, John McNamara Square, Borough of the Bronx.

ADMINISTRATIVE CODE: Amends section B4-20.0 of title B of chapter four.

INTENT:

This legislation will name a presently unnamed triangle, formed by the intersection of Randall Avenue, Calhoun Avenue and the service road of the Cross Bronx Expressway, John McNamara Square.

in the Melrose section of the Bronx, the youngest son of John and Elizabeth McNamara. John's family originally came to Throggs Neck in the summer of 1916 when the Shaw family was renting tent sites in Edgewater Park. At the early age of ten or eleven, John received some old charts from Captain Charlie Ferreira, the lighthouse keeper at Fort Schuyler, which started him on a lifelong career as a Bronx historian.

John eventually married an Edgewater girl, Pauline Ungerer, and settled there in 1940 to raise a family. He established himself as a freelance writer and in 1956 began his very popular column "The Bronx in History" for the Bronx Press-Review.

His avid interest in the History of the Bronx also led him to become a founding member of the Bronx County Historical Society. The same interest caused him to walk each byway, path and street in the borough to search for the origin of each street name. It was a pursuit that entailed years of research, but one he would not abandon. The final result of this endeavor was the publication in 1978 of "Streets of Asphalt," a comprehensive history of every roadway in the Bronx. In the summer of 1984, the 522 page volume was up-dated, expanded to 569 pages and re-released by the Bronx County Historical Society.

As recognition of the great work of Mr. McNamara in keeping historical records of the roadways in the Bronx, it is a most fitting tribute to name this triangle after him.

City Planning notes this bill conforms to the city map. The Community Planning Board is in support of this legislation.

We are aware that you have introduced this legislation in the City Council and we are supportive of it's passage.


