The Committee on Parks Recreation and Cultural Affairs to which was referred on February 19, 1971 (Minutes, page 268) the annexed local law, respectfully

REPORTS:

This proposed law would amend the Administrative Code by naming a triangular area bounded by the west side of Union Avenue, the north side of Metropolitan Avenue

and the southeast side of Brooklyn-Queens connecting highway.

Luigi A. Macri was a resident of the area and was very active in community affairs. He died in 1962. He was married for 28 years, a devoted husband and well respected in the community.

He had been a very dedicated member of the American Legion and in his honor the name of the 27th Memorial Post No. 1751 was changed to the Luigi A. Maeri Post No. 1751. Its headquarters are at 502 Lorimer Street. He held a responsible position with the Department of Sanitation. While serving as a Commander of this Post for two years he gained the respect and admiration of all members.

This American Legion Post in 1959 dedicated a monument located at Union and Metropolitan Avenues to all the deceased men of the community who died in World War II. The square on which it is located is unnamed and is the subject matter of this bill.

Accordingly, your committee recommends its adoption.

ADMINISTRATIVE CODE: Amends §B4-20.0.

DATA: This proposed law would amend the Administrative Code by naming a triangular area bounded by the west side of Union Avenue, the north side of Metropolitan Avenue and the southeast side of Brooklyn-Queens connecting highway.

Luigi A. Macri was a resident of the area and was very active in community affairs. He died in 1962. He was married for 28 years, a devoted husband and well respected in the community.

He had been a very dedicated member of the American Legion and in his honor the name of the 27th Memorial Post No. 1751 was changed to the Luigi A. Macri Post No. 1751. Its headquarters are at 502 Lorimer Street. He held a responsible position with the Department of Sanitation. While service as a Commander of this Post for two years he gained the respect and admiration of all members.

This American Legion Post in 1959 dedicated a monument located at Union and Metropolitan Avenues to all the deceased men of the community who died in World War II. The square on which it is located is unnamed and in the subject matter of this bill.


