A LOCAL LAW

To amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to name of plaza (Private Sidney Weissman memorial plaza, borough of the Bronx).

Be it enacted by the Council as follows:

Section 1. Section B4-10 of the administrative code of the city of New York is hereby amended by adding thereto a new designation to read as follows:

§ B4-10 **Bronx:** Change certain street name. The following street name is designated as hereinafter indicated:

New name	Old name	Limits
Private Sidney Weissman Memorial plaza	Esplanade	A longitudinal strip of land 56 feet in width centrally located about the center line of Esplanade (140 feet wide) having a northerly frontage of 67.513 feet on the southerly side of Astor avenue, 300 feet in length on its easterly side, 56 feet in length on its southerly side and 262.290 feet in length on its westerly side.

§ 2. This local law shall take effect immediately.

Report of the Committee on Parks and Thoroughfares in Favor of Adopting a Local Law to Amend the Administrative Code of The City of New York, in Relation to Name of Plaza (Private Sidney Weissman Memorial Plaza, Borough of The Bronx).

The Committee on Parks and Thoroughfares, to which was referred on July 3, 1962 (Minutes, page 7), the annexed Local Law to amend the Administrative Code of The City of New York, in relation to name of plaza (private Sidney Weissman Memorial Plaza, Borough of the Bronx), respectfully

REPORTS:

This measure was the subject of our deliberations on October 30, 1962.

We were informed that Pvt. Sidney Weissman was killed on November 27, 1943, at age 30, after approximately one year of active service with Company B, 31st Signal Construction Battalion of the Signal Corps.

He had been stationed in Oran, Africa, when his Battalion was ordered to join a convoy heading for the Burma Road. He sailed with his Company on the British Ship "Rhona." The convoy was attacked by German bombers. The "Rhona" was one of the first ships to be struck by bombs. After the war, two buddies of his, reported to his family, that when they last saw him, he was alive and helping others who were wounded. This sinking of the "Rhona," was the first major loss to the United States, in which over 1,000 American soldiers were lost.

The family of the late Pvt. Sidney Weissman were posthumously awarded the Purple Heart Medal.

Therefore, we recommend the adoption of this proposed Local Law.

Section 1. Section B4-10 of the administrative code of the city of New York is hereby amended by adding thereto a new designation to read as follows:



A LOCAL LAW to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to name of plaza (**Private Sidney Weissman memorial plaza, borough of the Bronx**).

Be it enacted by the Council as follows:

Section 2. Section B4-10 of the administrative code of the city of New York is hereby amended by adding thereto a new designation to read as follows:

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in building construction edition of February, 1935.] *Recommended practice for resistance welding, edition of 1950.*

(h) Painting or dipping of steel joists—

1. Painting of steel joists shall be in accordance with the requirements of section C26-522.0, or the joists shall be dipped once in hot asphalt at the place of manufacture or given two coats of asphalt either by dipping or spraying or an equivalent protective coating approved by the Commissioner, applied at the place of manufacture. When either hot or cold asphalt is used, all abrasions shall be touched up at the job with the same material. [The method of application and the quality of the material used in the cold asphalt dipping or spraying process shall be approved by the superintendent. The asphalt used in the hot dipping process shall meet the following specifications:

- Melting point, ball and ring method, 225-235 degrees fahrenheit.
- Penetration at 32 degrees fahrenheit, 200 gr., 60 seconds, 8-10.
- Penetration at 77 degrees fahrenheit, 100 gr., 5 seconds, 12-16.
- Penetration at 122 degrees fahrenheit, 5 seconds, 42-48.
- Specific gravity at 77 degrees fahrenheit, 1.07-1.08, ash, 5-6 per cent.
- Fire point (New York open cup), above 590 degrees fahrenheit.
- Flash point (New York open cup), above 605 degrees fahrenheit.
- Solubility in CS₂ at least 99 per cent.
- Solubility in CCl₄ at least 99 per cent.
- Volatility at 325 degrees fahrenheit for five hours, five-tenths per cent, or less.]

If an asphaltic base paint is used it shall include asphaltic bitumen containing not over 10 per cent of carbon pigment and not over 10 per cent of saponifiable material. The paint shall dry to a firm, elastic film before joists are loaded for shipment and shall not soften sufficiently to drip at 120 degrees F.

2. A certificate as to the quality of the asphalt shall be furnished to the [superintendent] Commissioner by an approved testing laboratory.

§4. This local law shall take effect immediately.
