A LOCAL LAW

To amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to name of plaza (Private Sidney Weissman memorial plaza, borough of the Bronx).

Be it enacted by the Council as follows:

Section 1. Section B4-10 of the administrative code of the city of New York is hereby amended by adding thereto a new designation to read as follows:

§ B4-10 Bronx: Change certain street name. The following street name is designated as hereinafter indicated:

New name	Old name	Limits
Private Sidney Weissman Memorial plaza	Esplanade	A longitudinal strip of land 56 feet in width centrally 10 cated about the center line of Esplanade (140 feet wide) having a northerly frontage of 67.513 feet on the southerly side of Astor avenue, 300 feet in length on its easterly side, 56 feet in length on its southerly side and 262290 feet in length on its westerly side.

^{§ 2.} This local law shall take effect immediately.

Report of the Committee on Parks and Thoroughfares in Favor of Adopting a Local Law to Amend the Administrative Code of The City of New York, in Relation to Name of Plaza (Private Sidney Weissman Memorial Plaza,

The Committee on Parks and Thoroughfares, to which was referred on July 3, 1962 (Minutes, page 7), the annexed Local Law to amend the Administrative Code of The City of New York, in relation to name of plaza (private Sidney Weissman Memorial Plaza, Borough of the Bronx), respectfully

REPORTS:

This measure was the subject of our deliberations on October 30, 1962.

We were informed that Pvt. Sidney Weissman was killed on November 27, 1943, at age 30, after approximately one year of active service with Company B, 31st Signal Construction Battalion of the Signal Corps.

He had been stationed in Oran, Africa, when his Battalion was ordered to join a convoy heading for the Burma Road. He sailed with his Company on the British Ship "Rhona." ple Heart Medal.
